**Keynote Address:** *The Politics of Health Care*

From coverage and cost, to risk sharing and regulation, Brownstein will provide a panoramic picture of how the Donald Trump era is likely to change the equation for patients, physicians, hospitals, insurers and all other key institutions in the health care industry.

Michigan currently is evaluating potential pilot programs to better integrate the physical and behavioral health benefits through managed care. The state also is taking part in the Duals demo (MI Health Link) to better integrate care for Medicaid/Medicare dual eligible. In the passage of state legislation which created the Healthy Michigan Act (Medicaid expansion), the legislature included language requiring the State to craft a path towards a managed care LTSS program.

The discussion will include high level overviews of how managed care is being asked to manage the Medicare/Medicaid dual eligible, Long Term Care eligible, and behavioral health Medicaid populations in Michigan and throughout the nation.
